
CAREER DAY Another Learning Experience



Herr Dieter Zink has lived in Karlsruhe for 39 years with his wife who teaches in the Elementary School. They were married in 1951 and they have one son.




Then when Karlsruhe High School was built, he started teaching here. As we all know, he's been working at KAHS ever since. Zink has devoted 27 years to our school.




